Providence Church's Approved Reopening Plan Friday, June 12, 2020

Providence Church will reopen in 3 phases, beginning <u>Sunday</u>, <u>July 5</u>. We will continue to offer an online service for those preferring to join from home.

Phase 1

- 1. Limit people to 30% of facility capacity approx. 90 people with RSVP expectation.
- 2. Anyone displaying symptoms of COVID-19 (including elevated temperature, cough, shortness of breath, muscle ache, and runny noise) will be asked to stay home and join online.
- 3. Maintaining a physical distance of 6 feet at all times.
- 4. Suspension of all nursery care and children's ministries. Children are welcome to join their families in the worship space.
- 5. Single-use bathrooms, with an outside attendant.
- 6. Alcohol-based hand sanitizer available outside both entrances (upper and lower)
- 7. Masks are optional, not required. Non-medical masks will be made available outside both entrances, as a hospitality gesture.
- 8. Entrance/exit doors are permanently opened or are opened by an attendant.
- 9. Contact-free greeting at both entrances.
- 10. Directional traffic (to be worked out by staff and clearly communicated on floors or by signage).
- 11. One row and three seats between all family units.
- 12. People will be directed to use the screens for singing and Bible reading, instead of using the provided hymnals/Bibles in the seats.
- 13. Suspension of the Sacraments of Baptism and Communion.
- 14. Offerings received at self-standing receptacles upon exiting worship space.
- 15. Suspension of coffee and refreshment service.
- 16. People will be directed to fellowship outside if desired, weather permitting, observing physical distancing guidelines.
- 17. Enhanced cleaning and disinfection practices before, during and after the worship gathering.

<u>Phase 2</u> will see a relaxing of some of the restrictions; to be determined and communicated at a later date.

<u>Phase 3</u> will essentially be a full resuming of worship practices and ministries, with an increased attention to cleaning and disinfection practices.

We are making no commitments on a timeline for Phase 2 and Phase 3.
